The Temple of Hephaestus, dedicated to the god of metal-working and craftsmanship, is located in Athens, Greece. The temple was designed by Ictinus, one of the Parthenon's architects. The Temple of Hephaestus is the best-preserved ancient Greek temple in the world.


The temple is dedicated to Hephaestus. The son of Zeus and Hera was the Greek god of craftsmen, artisans and sculptors. He was also the blacksmith to the gods on Mount Olympus.



Type I:
Greek letters Alpha, Delta & Lambda have Pointed Tops
Numeral 1 is 1.5mm wide at Bottom
Numeral 1 has a Straight Slanting Serif at top



Type II
Greek letters Alpha, Delta & Lambda have FLAT Tops
Numeral 1 is 2mm wide at Bottom
Numeral 1 has a Curved Serif at top, Perf 14



Type III
Greek letters Alpha, Delta & Lambda have Pointed Tops
The Lower left Numeral 1 has NO Serif at Left of Foot
The Lines of the Temple are more detailed & are more clear
